## INTRODUCING "ACCEPTED"

From the November night we will be introducing a new option for voting on club nights - The Accepted Card!

CCE

This card will be white with black text and provides a unique option for those that get voted "Accepted". IF an image receives a majority

accepted vote, then the image can be resubmitted (if so desired) to a club night in the same calendar year with changes that were suggested when the vote occurred. When resubmitted the image will be joined by the original entry for a side-by-side comparison.

The "Accepted" card is meant to be used sparingly, but can be a great tool to help unearth the potential that an image could be hiding if only for some "creative cropping" or exposure adjustments etc.

This is meant to be a helpful learning tool, something to help a photographer grow, not as the lowest possible option to vote.

## CALCULATING ISO BY THE INTENSITY OF THE LIGHT SOURCE



**ISO 100** Full sun and no shade



**ISO 1000** 

Mid-level lighting condition, indoors or outdoors



Shade, overcast day, or inside near a window

Low-light interiors

or post-sunset



Deep shade or heavily overcast day

**ISO 400** 



ISO 1600

Extremely low light



Early or late hours of

the day: sunrise or sunset

ISO 640-800

Bright interiors

ISO is the level of sensitivity of your camera to light. The lower

the ISO number, the less sensitive it is to the light. The higher

the ISO number, the more sensitive it is to the light.

<u>Whats Involved?</u> Your subject (you can choose more than 1 If you need a backup!) of choice must be registered with committee by the end of our December club night, either in person on the night or by email by that night if you cannot attend the club meeting that night. This will then be the subject that you will photograph over the Christmas period. The assignment process requires you to produce a **"set" of 10 images on 1 subject** to bring to the February 2025 club night.
